A LETTER FROM OUR *Executive Director*

Dear Champions,

As I reflect on 2025, I am filled with gratitude and deep admiration for the incredible teen moms we have the privilege to serve. Their resilience, determination and love for their children continue to inspire us all. While balancing motherhood, many are pursuing education, working and overcoming significant barriers—yet they continue to press forward.

This year marked both growth and transition for Hope House Northern Colorado. As I stepped into the role of executive director, I have been continually encouraged by the strength of our mission and the unwavering support of this community.

In 2025, we served 39 teen moms and 53 children—a 30% increase from the prior year—reflecting both the growing need and the trust families place in our program. Alongside this growth, we strengthened our services to support both immediate needs and long-term success. From direct assistance like diapers and transportation support, to evidence-based parenting, financial literacy, and healthy relationships classes, we are equipping teen moms with tools to thrive. We also introduced professional GED tutoring, helping moms make meaningful progress toward their educational goals, and expanded access to licensed counseling through a new partnership.

We remain committed to measuring impact through our Hope House Self-Sufficiency Rubric, walking alongside each mom as she sets goals and builds stability for her family. We also continued developmental screenings for children to ensure early support when needed.

None of this work is possible without you. Your generosity is helping break cycles of poverty and build brighter futures for two generations.

As we look ahead, we are preparing to grow our space and expand our reach to serve even more families in need.

GED Program



Teen parenting can be overwhelming and often leads to moms leaving high school before graduation. Hope House Northern Colorado helps bridge that gap by offering a free GED Program for moms who were unable to earn their diploma. We also provide subject-specific tutoring for those who need extra academic support. Since launching the GED Program in 2022, five teen moms have graduated, with Isleana being the most recent success story.

Areas of Focus

ASQ-3

Ages & Stages Questionnaires

The Ages & Stages Questionnaires®, Third Edition (ASQ®-3) is a trusted developmental screening tool designed to help identify young children who may need additional support.

Completed by parents or caregivers, the ASQ-3 looks at five key areas of development: communication, gross motor skills, fine motor skills, problem-solving and personal-social skills. The questionnaire helps caregivers and professionals better understand a child's strengths and spot potential delays early, so children can receive the right resources and interventions at the right time.

In 2025, Hope House NoCO programming staff assessed 11 children and re-assessed two. Their goal for 2026 is to assess 30% of the children we serve.

Donations



Transportation is one of the biggest barriers teen moms face on their journey toward stability. In 2026, we are working to increase the number of car donations we receive so more moms can get to school, work, child care and appointments safely and reliably. Through our Driven to Donate partnership, your vehicle—running or not—can be picked up hassle-free and transformed into dependable transportation for the teen moms we serve.
